Collegiate Training Compass:

Developing Vision for Campus

<u>What</u>: Staff-in-Training receive experience and feedback in leading beyond their personal, immediate contribution. They are growing in understanding how gospel movements can be ignited and sustained in various campus contexts.

<u>Why</u>: You are preparing the next generation of staff leaders! We want them trusting God and experiencing a variety of means and methods in which a campus is reached with the gospel, so that they can ignite disciple making movements wherever they go next.

There is no single prescribed method for reaching a campus, so staff should be exposed to a variety of approaches, viewpoints, and practices. Through these experiences the staff learns to carry out the core Navigator values and convictions.

Questions for your radar:

- Can they articulate their vision for life-long disciplemakers? Do they have any key verses/ promises they are praying for the campus? Can they share stories of God's work here?
- Have they been invited into conversations about ministry strategy and long-term planning?
- What biases or barriers do they have in developing a vision?
- What kind of cross-training campus experience would be helpful in rounding out their vision for what a Navigator ministry looks like?
- What experiences might help them learn to relate well with the University and other ministries?
