## **Collegiate Training Compass:**

Faith

What: An SiTer is learning to live out faith and dependence on God in their life and ministry.

<u>Why</u>: While SiT provides an incredible opportunity to grow in skill and competency, it would be in vain if not paired with faith in a promising God. We want to grow leaders who trust God! The Navigators have recently named five traditional strongholds that faith helps combat—pride, control, fear, critical spirit and independence.

Learning to live and lead with faith should be a consistent experience of SiT—this may be demonstrated through their posture during fundraising, unexpected moves, challenging student situations, operating outside of their desired skill set, wrestling honestly with God as doubts arise, pleading promises for his work on campus, etc.

## Questions for your radar:

- In what ways have I observed them ministering out of dependence on God?
- In what ways are they tempted to minister out of control, independence, fear or pride? Are they aware of these tendencies?
- How can I challenge them to stretch their faith?
- What promises are they pleading before God?
- What's the biggest thing they're trusting God for?
- How are they handling doubts that arise?
- What stories can I tell them of ways I've seen God come through?
