Collegiate Training Compass: SHAW

<u>What</u>: SiTers receive coaching and development in their own personal SHAW journey and in helping others in their journeys.

<u>Why</u>: To be a fruitful, long-term disciplemaker, one must both personally walk in sexual integrity and know how to invite others into repentance, freedom, and restoration. Staff-in-Training should be growing in their understanding of how to bring the gospel to students in the area of sexual brokenness, both in evangelism and discipleship.

<u>Questions for your radar</u>:

- Do they know how to create an atmosphere of vulnerability and trust in their discipleship relationships?
- What training or development might they need to help a student with a story of sexual brokenness?
- Can they explain the orthodox Biblical sexual ethic the Navigators holds to as they disciple students and why it matters?
- Do they know how to help a student with a story different from theirs?
- Do they personally need any additional counseling or accountability in their personal SHAW journey?
- What could most help them develop a greater depth of conviction, experience and skill in this area? (Lead a SHAW study for students? Rewire for first year EDGErs? Attend Shaw 101?)
